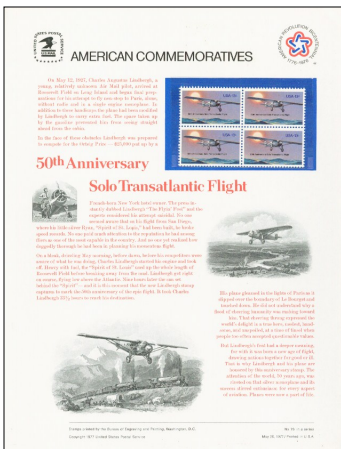

Babe Zaharias



In 1930 Bobby Jones did something nobody else had ever done before. He won the "Grand Slam of Golf" — the U.S. Open, British Open, U.S. Amateur and British Amateur all in the same year... and no one has done it since.

Born in Atlanta, Georgia on March 17, 1902, this exceptional athlete got off to an early start in his golfing career, winning the Georgia state championship at age 16. Some years later he won the U.S. Open, the first major victory. In 1924 and 1925 he won the U.S. Amateur and in 1926 he became the first golfer to win both the U.S. and British Open Titles.

Bobby Jones retired from golf in 1930 to devote time to his law practice. In all, Jones won the U.S. Amateur five times, the U.S. Open four times, British Amateur once and British Open three times. He was considered the greatest amateur golfer that ever lived. Bobby Jones died in his hometown of Atlanta in 1971.

It was Babe Zaharias who put power into women's golf. "There's no one else who," she would often say, "you could hit a ball like that!" Babe not only helped found the Ladies Professional Golf Association, she also set the pace for another new style of golf for women.

But Mikko (Dottie) Zaharias began long before the discovery golf. In the 1930's, Zaharias, like many top female athletes, turned to the sports and golf center located, and a great medal in the high jump.

From the late 30's to early 50's, her golfing career was marked by one outstanding achievement after another. Babe was seven times women's champion at least once. In less than 6 years on a touring professional golfer, she won 75 tournaments including four Women's Open Championships. Six years before her retirement from golf in 1956, she was chosen the outstanding woman athlete of the first half of the 20th Century.

The use of streetcars in some history. But from the early 1800s through the mid-1800s, the use of the cable cars, trolleys and streetcars, streetcars played an important part in the growth of American cities.

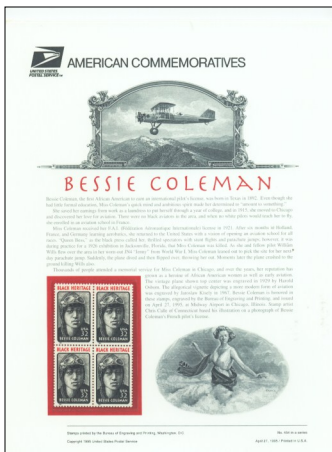
